About WEXRC

Wexford Rape Crisis began in 1995 providing a free counselling service for survivors of sexual violence and their families in the Co Wexford area. The service expanded as more and more survivors sought counselling and outreach services were developed in Gorey, Enniscorthy and New Ross. In 2019 the service expanded their remit further to provide counselling and support for those who experienced domestic and gender-based violence. The service has grown and expanded in response to rising needs and adapted well to the switch to telehealth and remote counselling during the Covid 19 Pandemic 2020/21.

Our vision is for a society free from sexual violence.

Our mission is to provide a client-centred support service for those who may have been affected by domestic, sexual or gender-based violence, including women, men, young people and all persons of different sexual or gender identities.

- Further develop our Child & Adolescent Counselling Service
- Deliver information and education workshops to parents to complement our work with young people
- Link in with teachers and continuous professional development (CPD) to support the SPHE programme in schools
- Raise awareness of our work through careful management and use of all media channels, including social media

Strategic Priority Two - Creating and cultivating relationships

Relationships matter and over the years we have built good working relationships that enhance collaborative capacity to respond to the needs of the people we serve. We are grateful for these relationships and we will continue to create and cultivate relationships and partnerships to advance our work in support of those who need our services.
